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DEFINITION AND MEASUREMENT OF CPI AND INFLATION RATE

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a macroeconomic indicator that provides a general measure of changes in the average prices of goods and services commonly purchased by consumers relative to a base period (the price reference period is 2024). The inflation rate is directly computed from the index. The inflation rate is the relative change in CPI between periods. Inflation rate is reported year-on-year (annual inflation rate) and month-on-month (monthly inflation rate). CPI is constructed using the following key variables: weights derived from estimates of household expenditures (the weight reference period is 2023), prices collected from selected retail outlets across the 36 States and FCT (both urban and rural), and quantities of goods and services. In the current CPI, there are 74 population strata, which are the urban and rural parts of Nigeria's 36 states and the FCT. The CPI basket has 242 item strata, defined by the 2018 version of Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP). The 2018 version of COICOP has 4 levels in its hierarchy: DIVISIONS, GROUPS, CLASSES, and SUB-CLASSES.

IMPORTANT NOTE

The December 2025 year-on-year Headline inflation rate, including all other sub-indexes were obtained through maximisation of the index reference period, that is, using a 12-month index reference period where the average CPI for the 12 months of 2024 is equated to 100. This is a departure from the single-month index reference period, in which December 2024 was set to 100, which would have produced an artificial spike in the December 2025 year-on-year inflation rate. This artificial spike is induced by the base effect, which is methodological, not structural, resulting in a rate that is not in tandem with current inflationary realities; hence the need to resort to the 12-month index reference period, by equating the entire 2024 to 100. This definitely affects the raising factor used for the re-referencing of the 2024 CPI series and the already released year-on-year inflation rates for January to November 2025.

This process is in line with International Best Practice as contained in the Consumer Price Index International Monetary Fund (IMF) Manual, specifically in Section 9.125 and the ECOWAS Harmonised CPI Manual, which address index reference period maximisation, following a rebasing exercise. The 2024 re-reference CPI and the revised year-on-year inflation rates for January to November 2025 can be found in the Excel Tables published together with this report on the NBS website.

HEADLINE INFLATION FOR DECEMBER 2025

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose to 131.2 in December 2025, up by 0.7 points from the previous month (130.5). The December 2025 year-on-year Headline inflation rate stood at 15.15% relative to the November 2025 headline inflation rate (17.33%).

On a year-on-year basis, the December Headline inflation rate was 19.65% lower than the rate recorded in December 2024 (34.80%). This shows that the Headline inflation rate (year-on-year basis) decreased in December 2025 compared to the same month in the preceding year (i.e., December 2024), though with a different base year, November 2009 = 100.

On a month-on-month basis, the Headline inflation rate in December 2025 was 0.54%, which is 0.69% less than the rate recorded in November 2025 (1.22%). This means that in December 2025, the rate of increase in the average price level was lower than in November 2025.

The percentage change in the average CPI for the twelve months ending December 2025 over the average for the previous twelve-month period stood at 23.01%.

DISAGGREGATION OF DECEMBER 2025 INFLATION RATE

URBAN INFLATION

On a year-on-year basis, in December 2025, the Urban inflation rate stood at 14.85% from 37.29% in December 2024. while on a month-on-month basis, the inflation rate rose to 0.99%, up by 0.03% from November 2025 (0.95%). The corresponding twelve-month average for the Urban inflation rate was 23.46%.

RURAL INFLATION

The Rural inflation rate in December 2025 stood at 14.56% on a year-on-year basis from 32.47% in December 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the rate declined to -0.55%, down by 2.43% compared to November 2025 (1.88%). In addition, the corresponding twelve-month average for the Rural inflation rate in December 2025 was 21.93%.

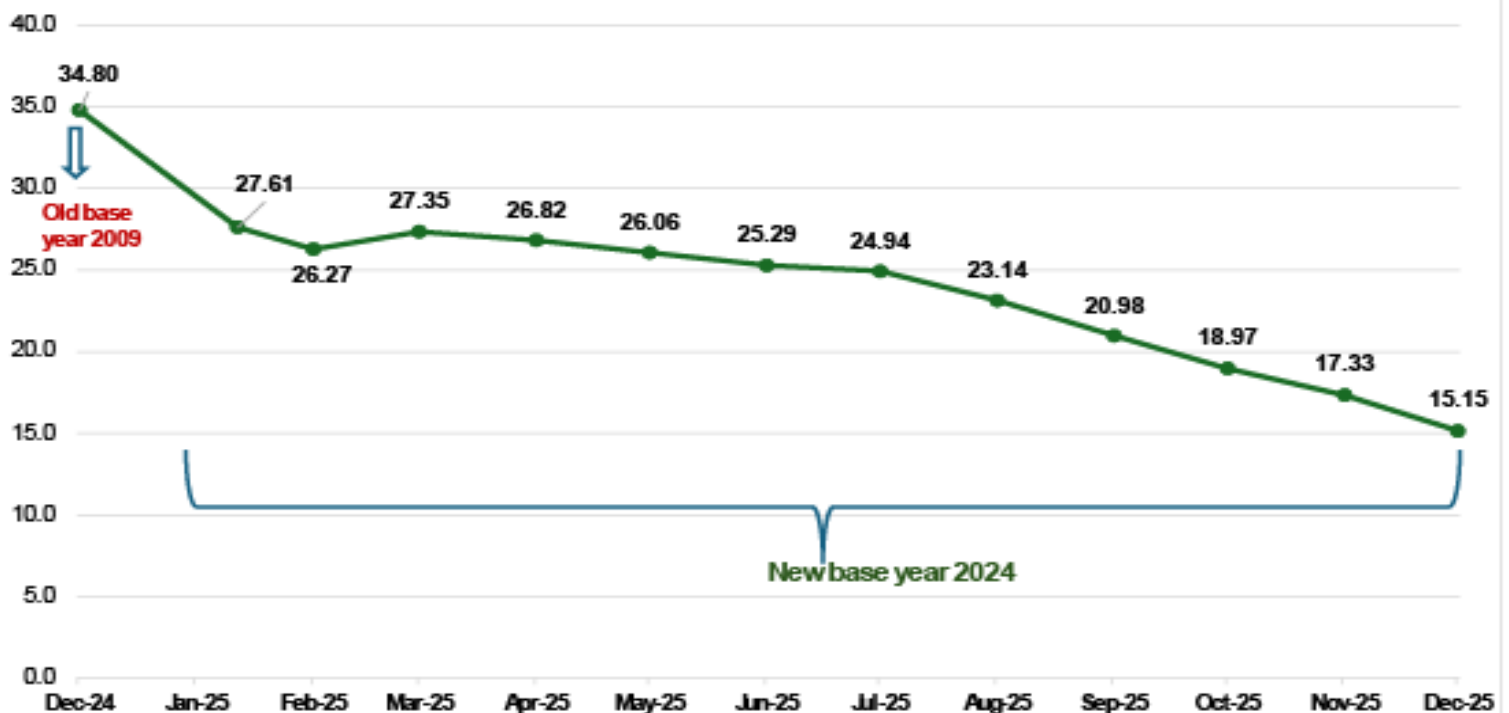

FOOD INFLATION

The Food inflation rate in December 2025 stood at 10.84% on a year-on-year basis from 39.84% in December 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the Food inflation rate declined to -0.36%, down by 1.49% compared to November 2025 (1.13%). This decline can be attributed to the rate of decrease in the average prices in the following food items, namely, Tomatoes, Garri, Eggs, Potatoes, Carrots, Millet, Vegetables, Plantain, Beans, Wheat Grain, Grounded Pepper, Onions (Fresh), etc.

The average annual rate of Food inflation for the twelve months ending December 2025, relative to the previous twelve-month average, stood at 22.00%.

The “All items less farm produce and energy” or Core inflation, which excludes the prices of volatile agricultural produce and energy, stood at 18.63% in December 2025 on a year-on-year basis from 29.28% in December 2024, while on a month-on-month basis, the Core Inflation rate was 0.58%, down by 0.7% compared to November 2025 (1.28%). The average twelve-month annual inflation rate stood at 23.49% for the twelve months ending December 2025.

STATE PROFILES

When analysing price movements under this section, it is essential to note that the CPI is weighted by consumption expenditure patterns that vary across States and locations. Accordingly, the weight assigned to a particular Food or Non-Food item may differ from State to State, making interstate comparisons of consumption baskets inadvisable and potentially misleading.

All Items Inflation

In December 2025, the All-Items inflation rate on a Year-on-Year basis was highest in Abia (19.03%), Ogun (18.80%), and Katsina (18.66%), while Sokoto (8.61%), Plateau (9.05%) and Kaduna (10.38%) recorded the lowest rise in Headline inflation on a Year-on-Year basis. On a Month-on-Month basis, however, December 2025 recorded the highest increases in Cross River (3.11%), Abia (2.63%) and Delta (2.53%), while Ondo (-3.74%), Gombe (-3.02%), and Jigawa (-1.96%) recorded a decline in the Month-on-Month inflation.

Food Inflation

In December 2025, Food inflation on a Year-on-Year basis was highest in Yobe (15.25%), Ogun (14.12%), and Abuja (13.24%), while Akwa Ibom (4.34%), Sokoto (4.62%), and Plateau (6.19%) recorded the slowest rise in Food inflation on a Year-on-Year basis. On a Month-on-Month basis, however, December 2025 Food inflation was highest in Imo (3.19%), Nasarawa (3.16%), and Yobe (1.18%), while Plateau (-2.76%), Rivers (-2.50%), and Zamfara (-1.93%) recorded a decline in Food inflation on a Month-on-Month basis.
