DEFINITION AND MEASUREMENT OF CPI AND INFLATION RATE

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a macroeconomic indicator that provides a general measure of changes in the average prices of goods and services commonly purchased by consumers relative to a base period (the price reference period is 2024). The inflation rate is directly computed from the index. The inflation rate is the relative change in CPI between periods. Inflation rate is reported year-on-year (annual inflation rate) and month-on-month (monthly inflation rate). CPI is constructed using the following key variables: weights derived from estimates of household expenditures (the weight reference period is 2023), prices collected from selected retail outlets across the 36 States and FCT (both urban and rural), and quantities of goods and services. In the current CPI, there are 74 population strata, which are the urban and rural parts of Nigeria's 36 states and the FCT. The CPI basket has 242 item strata, defined by the 2018 version of Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP). The 2018 version of COICOP has 4 levels in its hierarchy: DIVISIONS, GROUPS, CLASSES, and SUB-CLASSES.

HEADLINE INFLATION FOR JUNE 2025

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose to 123.4 in June 2025, reflecting a 2.0-point increase from the preceding month (121.4)

In June 2025, the Headline inflation rate eased to **22.22%** relative to the May 2025 headline inflation rate of 22.97%. Looking at the movement, the June 2025 Headline inflation rate showed a decrease of 0.75% compared to the May 2025 Headline inflation rate.

On a year-on-year basis, the Headline inflation rate was 11.97% lower than the rate recorded in June 2024 (34.19%). This shows that the Headline inflation rate (year-on-year basis) decreased in June 2025 compared to the same month in the preceding year (i.e., June 2024), though with a different base year, November 2009 = 100.

On a month-on-month basis, the Headline inflation rate in June 2025 was 1.68%, which was 0.15% higher than the rate recorded in May 2025 (1.53%). This means that in June 2025, the rate of increase in the average price level was higher than the rate of increase in the average price level in May 2025.

The percentage change in the average CPI for the twelve months ending June 2025 over the average for the previous twelve-month period was 26.58%, showing a 3.42% decrease compared to 30.00% recorded in June 2024.

DISAGGREGATION OF MAY 2025 INFLATION RATE

URBAN INFLATION

On a year-on-year basis, in June 2025, the Urban inflation rate was 22.72%, 13.83% points lower compared to the 36.55% recorded in June 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the Urban inflation rate was 2.11% in June 2025, up by 0.71% compared to May 2025 (1.40 %). The corresponding twelve-month average for the Urban inflation rate was 28.16% in June 2025. This was 3.92% points lower compared to the 32.08% reported in June 2024.

RURAL INFLATION

The Rural inflation rate in June 2025 was 20.85% on a year-on-year basis. This was 11.24% points lower compared to the 32.09% recorded in June 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the Rural inflation rate in June 2025 was 0.63%, down by 1.2% compared to May 2025 (1.83%). The corresponding twelve-month average for the Rural inflation rate in June 2025 was 24.65%. This was 3.5% points lower compared to the 28.15% recorded in June 2024.

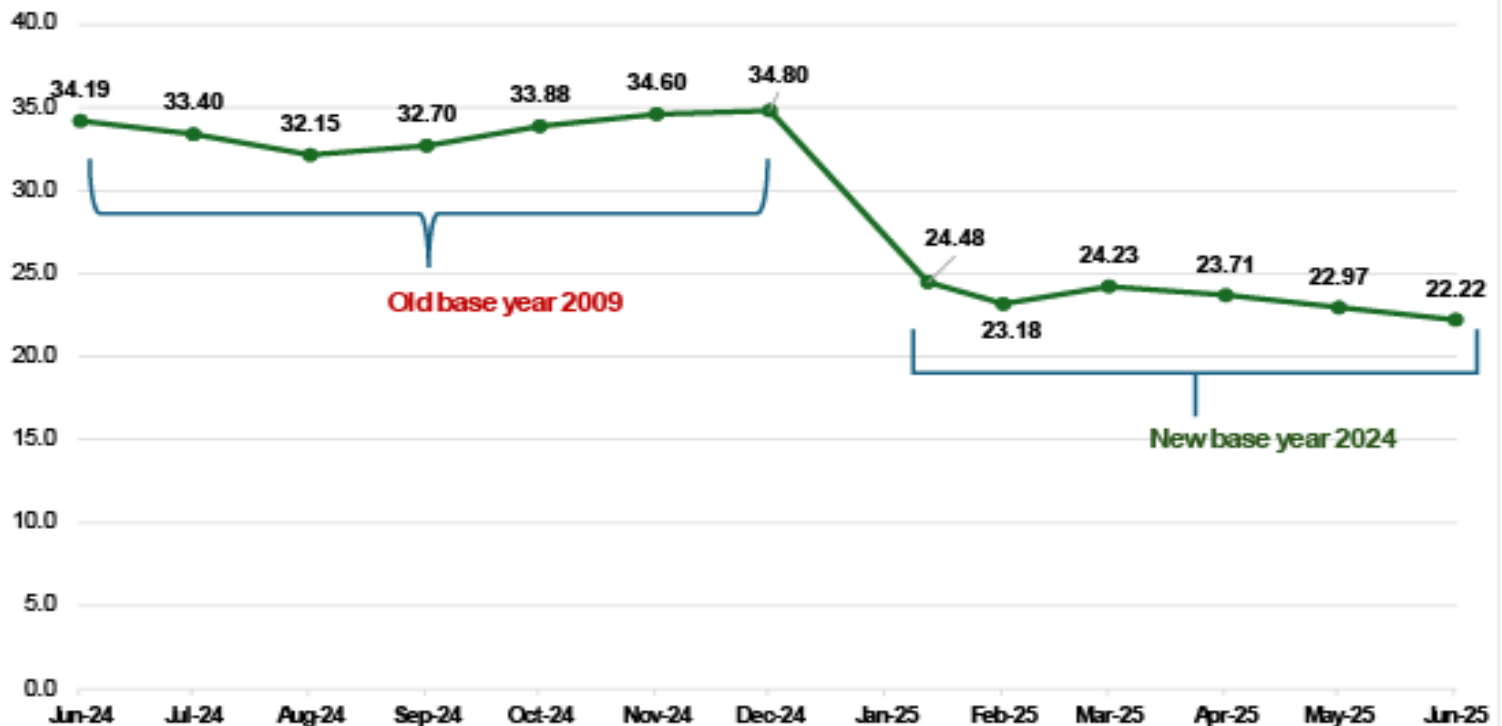

FOOD INFLATION

The Food inflation rate in **June 2025** was **21.97%** on a year-on-year basis. This was 18.93% points lower compared to the rate recorded in June 2024 (40.87%). The significant decline in the annual food inflation figure is technically due to the change in the base year. On a month-on-month basis, the Food inflation rate in June 2025 was 3.25%, up by 1.07% compared to May 2025 (2.19%). The increase can be attributed to the rate of increase in the average prices of Green Peas (Dried), Pepper (Fresh), Shrimps (white dried), Crayfish, Meat (Fresh), Tomatoes (Fresh), Plantain Flour, Ground Pepper, etc.

The average annual rate of Food inflation for the twelve months ending June 2025 over the previous twelve-month average was 28.28%, which was 7.02% points lower compared with the average annual rate of change recorded in June 2024 (35.3%).

ALL ITEMS LESS FARM PRODUCE AND ENERGY (CORE INFLATION)

The “All items less farm produces and energy” or Core inflation, which excludes the prices of volatile agricultural produces and energy, stood at 22.76% in June 2025 on a year-on-year basis; declined by 4.64% when compared to the 27.4% recorded in June 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the Core Inflation rate was 2.46% in [June 2025](#), up by 1.36% compared to May 2025 (1.10%). The average twelve-month annual inflation rate was 24.14% for the twelve months ending June 2025, which was 0.04% points higher than the 24.01% recorded in June 2024.

STATE PROFILES

In analysing price movements under this section, it should be noted that CPI is weighted by consumption expenditure patterns that differ across States and locations. Accordingly, the weight assigned to a particular Food or Non-Food item may differ from State to State making interstate comparisons of consumption basket inadvisable and potentially misleading.

All Items Inflation

In June 2025, All Items inflation rate on a Year-on-Year basis was highest in Borno (31.63%), Abuja (26.79%), and Benue (25.91%), while Zamfara (9.90%), Yobe (13.51%), Sokoto (15.78%) recorded the lowest rise in Headline inflation on Year-on-Year basis. On a Month-on-Month basis, however, June 2025 recorded the highest increases in Ekiti (5.39%), Delta (5.15%), Lagos (5.13%), while Zamfara (-6.89%), Niger (-5.35%) and Plateau (-4.01%) recorded the lowest rise in Month-on-Month inflation.

Food Inflation

In June 2025, Food inflation on a Year-on-Year basis was highest in Borno (47.40%), Ebonyi (30.62%), Bayelsa (28.64%), while Katsina (6.21%), Adamawa (10.90%), and Sokoto (15.25%) recorded the slowest rise in Food inflation on Year-on-Year basis. On a Month-on-Month basis, however, June 2025 Food inflation was highest in Enugu (11.90%), Kwara (9.97%), and Rivers (9.88%) while Borno (-7.63%), Sokoto (-6.43%) and Bayelsa (-6.34%), recorded decline in Food inflation on Month-on-Month basis.
