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## DEFINITION AND MEASUREMENT OF CPI AND INFLATION RATE

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a macroeconomic indicator that provides a general measure of changes in the average prices of goods and services commonly purchased by consumers relative to a base period (the price reference period is 2024). The inflation rate is directly computed from the index. The inflation rate is the relative change in CPI between periods. Inflation rate is reported year-on-year (annual inflation rate) and month-on-month (monthly inflation rate). CPI is constructed using the following key variables: weights derived from estimates of household expenditures (the weight reference period is 2023), prices collected from selected retail outlets across the 36 States and FCT (both urban and rural), and quantities of goods and services. In the current CPI, there are 74 population strata, which are the urban and rural parts of Nigeria's 36 states and the FCT. The CPI basket has 242 item strata, defined by the 2018 version of Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP). The 2018 version of COICOP has 4 levels in its hierarchy: DIVISIONS, GROUPS, CLASSES, and SUB-CLASSES.

## HEADLINE INFLATION FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose to 127.7 in September 2025 reflecting a 0.9-point increase from the preceding month (126.8).

In September 2025, the Headline inflation rate eased to 18.02% relative to the August 2025 headline inflation rate of 20.12%. Looking at the movement, the September 2025 Headline inflation rate showed a decrease of 2.1% compared to the August 2025 Headline inflation rate.

In addition, on a year-on-year basis, the Headline inflation rate was 14.68% lower than the rate recorded in September 2024 (32.70%). This shows that the Headline inflation rate (year-on-year basis) decreased in September 2025 compared to the same month in the preceding year (i.e., September 2024), though with a different base year, November 2009 = 100.

However, on a month-on-month basis, the Headline inflation rate in September 2025 was 0.72%, which was 0.02% lower than the rate recorded in August 2025 (0.74%). This means that in September 2025, the rate of increase in the average price level was lower than the rate of increase in the average price level in August 2025.

The percentage change in the average CPI for the twelve months ending September 2025 over the average for the previous twelve-month period was 23.46%, showing a 8.27% decrease compared to 31.73% recorded in September 2024.

## **DISAGGREGATION OF SEPTEMBER 2025 INFLATION RATE**

### **URBAN INFLATION**

On a year-on-year basis, in September 2025, the Urban inflation rate was 17.50%, 17.63% points lower compared to the 35.13% recorded in September 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the Urban inflation rate was 0.74% in September 2025, up by 0.25% compared August 2025 (0.49 %). The corresponding twelve-month average for the Urban inflation rate was 24.35% in September 2025. This was 9.6% points lower compared to the 33.95% reported in September 2024.

### **RURAL INFLATION**

The Rural inflation rate in September 2025 was 18.26% on a year-on-year basis. This was 12.23% points lower compared to the 30.49% recorded in September 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the Rural inflation rate in September 2025 was 0.67%, down by 0.71% compared to August 2025 (1.38%). The corresponding twelve-month average for the Rural inflation rate in September 2025 was 22.08%. This was 7.68% points lower compared to the 29.76% recorded in September 2024.

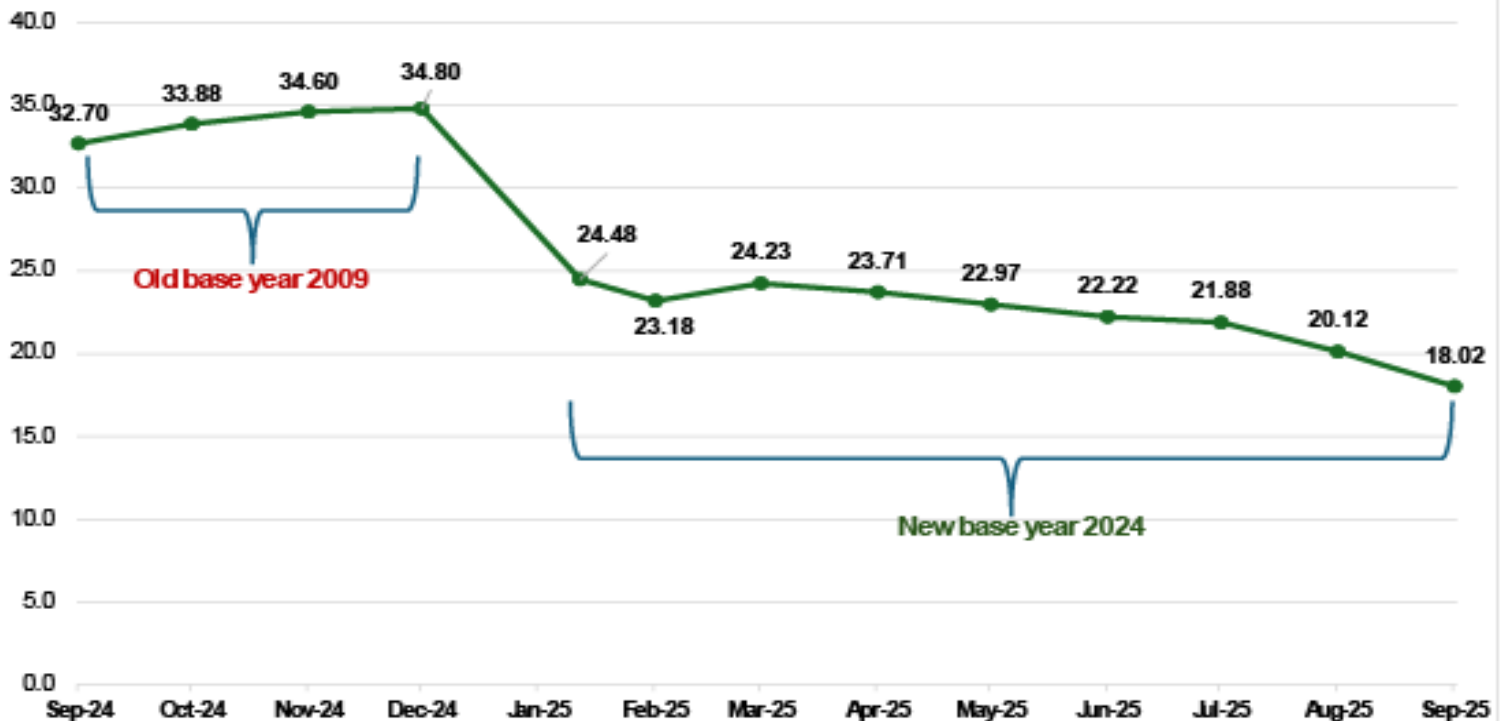

## FOOD INFLATION

The Food inflation rate in September 2025 was 16.87% on a year-on-year basis. This was 20.9% points lower compared to the rate recorded in September 2024 (37.77%). The significant decline in the annual food inflation figure is technically due to the change in the base year. However, on a month-on-month basis, the Food inflation rate in September 2025 was -1.57%, down by 3.22% compared to August 2025 (1.65%). The decrease can be attributed to the rate of decrease in the average prices of Maize (Corn) Grains, Garri, Beans, Millet, Potatoes, Onions, Eggs, Tomatoes, Fresh Pepper etc.

The average annual rate of Food inflation for the twelve months ending September 2025 over the previous twelve-month average was 24.06%, which was 13.47% points lower compared with the average annual rate of change recorded in September 2024 (37.53%).

## ALL ITEMS LESS FARM PRODUCE AND ENERGY (CORE INFLATION)

The “All items less farm produces and energy” or Core inflation, which excludes the prices of volatile agricultural produces and energy stood at 19.53% in September 2025 on a year-on-year basis; declined by 7.9% when compared to the 27.43% recorded in September 2024. On a month-on-month basis, the Core Inflation rate was 1.42% in September 2025 down by 0.01% compared to August 2025 (1.43%). The average twelve-month annual inflation rate was 22.39% for the twelve months ending September 2025, this was 3.25% points lower than the 25.64% recorded in September 2024

## STATE PROFILES

In analysing price movements under this section, it should be noted that CPI is weighted by consumption expenditure patterns that differ across States and locations. Accordingly, the weight assigned to a particular Food or Non-Food item may differ from State to State making interstate comparisons of consumption basket inadvisable and potentially misleading.

### All Items Inflation

In September 2025, All Items inflation rate on a Year-on-Year basis was highest in Adamawa (23.69%), Katsina (23.53%), and Nasarawa (22.29%), while Anambra (9.28%), Niger (11.79%) and Bauchi (12.36%) recorded the lowest rise in Headline inflation on a Year-on-Year basis. On a Month-on-Month basis, however, September 2025 recorded the highest increases in Zamfara (9.36%), Adamawa (8.15%) and Nasarawa (7.49%), while Niger (-8.14%), Oyo (-5.56%), and Bayelsa (-4.61%) recorded decline in the Month-on-Month inflation.

### Food Inflation

In September 2025, Food inflation on a Year-on-Year basis was highest in Ekiti (28.68%), Rivers (24.18%), Nasarawa (22.74%), while Bauchi (2.81%), Niger (8.38%), and Anambra (8.41%) recorded the slowest rise in Food inflation on Year-on-Year basis. On a Month-on-Month basis, however, September 2025 Food inflation was highest in Zamfara (15.62%), Ekiti (12.77%), Sokoto (12.55%), and while Akwa Ibom (-12.97%), Borno (-12.95%), and Cross River (-10.36%) recorded decline in Food inflation on Month-on-Month basis.
